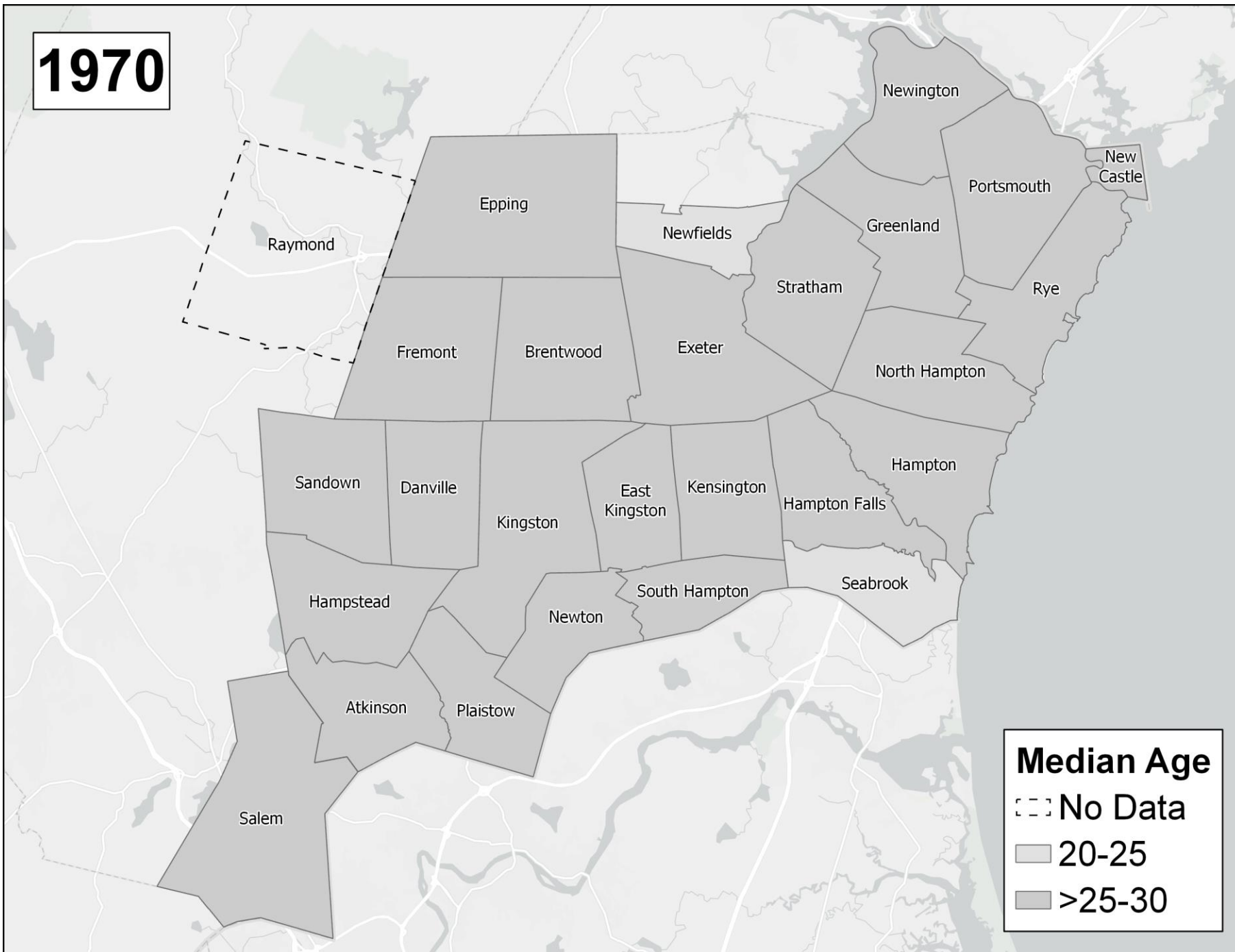

1970 Median Age – 29.5

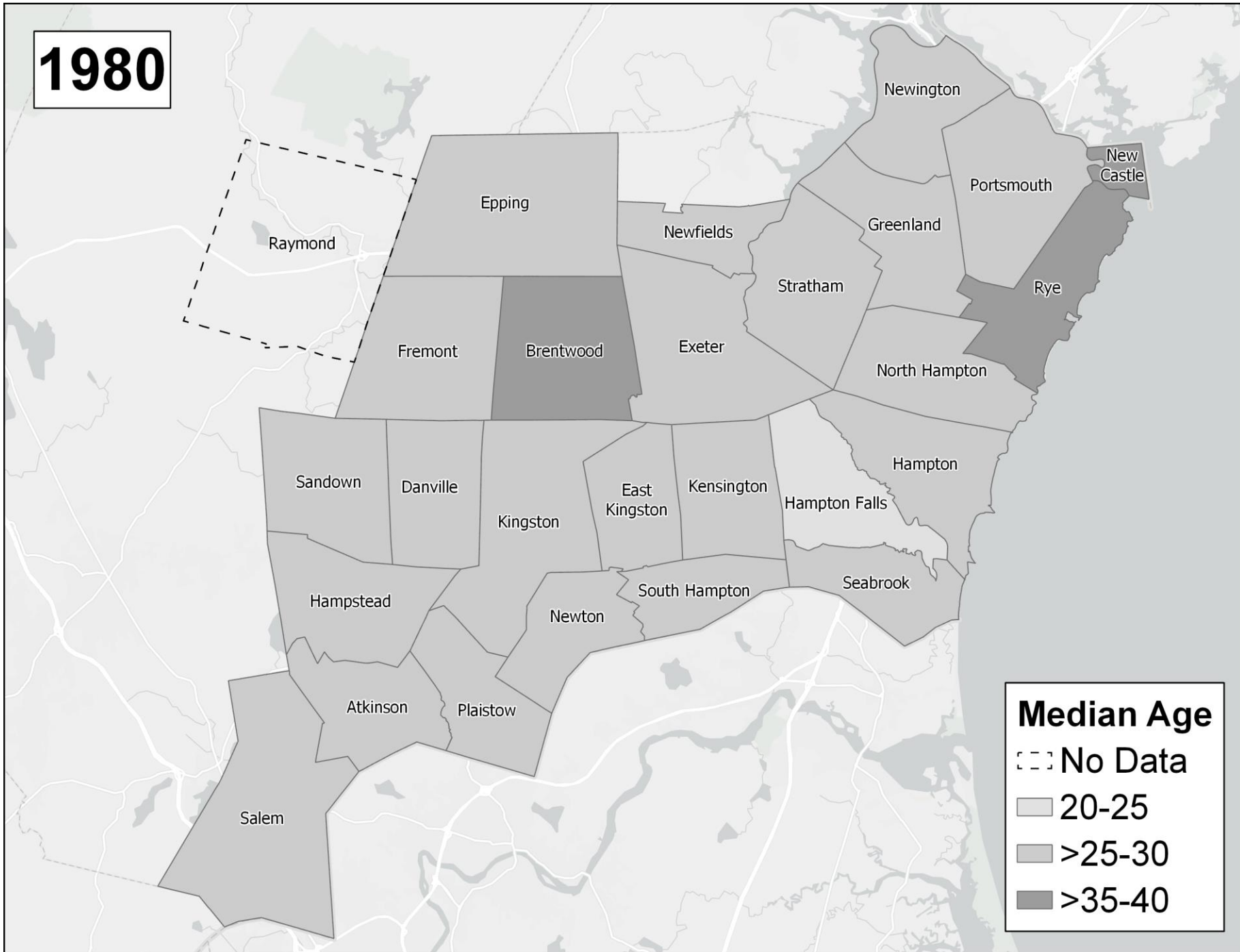
2016 Median Age – 44.9
